### **Top 5 Reminders**

- 1. <u>Thermostat</u>- Refrain from shutting your thermostat off because it could cause pipes to freeze in the building. We recommend you set your thermostat to at least 62 degrees.
- 2. <u>Baseboard Registers</u>- Always keep items away from your baseboards. If the heater is blocked, the heater unit will not convert properly.
- 3. <u>Shopping Carts & Laundry Carts</u>- Please physically return the cart to its proper location. Unfortunately, several carts are left in the hallways or put on the elevator for other residents to put back.
- 4. <u>Disposal of furniture, electronics, televisions</u>- Contact your maintenance person before leaving these items outside by the dumpster. The Housing Authority may be charged for some of these items; therefore, the resident may be charged.
- 5. <u>Apartment Doors</u>- Always keep your apartment door closed and locked.



Patrons may receive 1 complete food package per month. Accounts must be up-to-date and current.

Patrons would be able to receive smaller packages - produce and bakery (and possibly surplus items) – the other weeks of the month, one time per week.

We also offer drive-thru for complete food packages only for people 60+ or those who have had staff approval.

The drive-thru is open Wednesdays and Thursdays from 10:00am-12:00pm for people 60+ or by staff referral.

### **Mobile Food Pantry:**

Everyone in each of the high-rises qualifies for this free service.

You will need to wait in line. No one will be entering the WA-FER Mobile at this time. Everyone will get a choice of dairy, meats, produce, bakery, and a pre-packaged food box. There will be staff and volunteers to help lift items into carts. Residents can use the building shopping carts to bring items up to their apartment; however, please clean and return the cart immediately for the next person to use.

**PLEASE** be patient, kind, and respectful of others while waiting your turn.



# Stay healthy this year: What vaccines are right for you

Flu: The best way to reduce your risk from seasonal flu and its potentially serious complications is to get a flu vaccine. People over 6 months of age are recommended to receive the flu vaccine every year. Flu vaccine is available at your health care provider or local pharmacy.

COVID: COVID cases increased this summer. Another increase is expected in winter although the patterns are still developing and COVID is not as predictable as other seasonal illnesses. The updated COVID 24/25 vaccine is now available at your health care provider and local pharmacies. Everyone over age 6 months is recommended to receive a COVID vaccine this season.

**RSV:** RSV is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms. RSV can cause illness in people of all ages, but it may be more severe for infants and older adults. RSV vaccine is recommended for adults over age 60 with certain health conditions and everyone over age 75. It is also recommended for the protection of infants under age 20 months. To receive information RSV related on to age/health conditions/risk status eceive the RSV vaccine, consult your health care provider.



The Health Department offers flu and Covid-19 vaccines available to adults who are:

- underinsured or uninsured
- use Medicaid
- use Medicare

And Children 18 years old and younger who are:

- uninsured or underinsured
- -eligible or Medicaid-enrolled,
- American Indian or Alaska Native
